Recognising the achievements of young people in overcoming adversity, do the right thing or face challenging circumstances with courage and determination

Personal achievement in Arts

Recognising the achievements of young people in dance, film, drama and other crafts, as well as supporting and encouraging other young people to get involved

Personal achievement in Music

Recognising the achievement of young people in learning instruments, performing or supporting and encouraging other young people to get involved

Personal achievement in Sports

Recognising achievements of young people who participate in sport at any level, or coach and encourage other young people

Good friends and carers

Recognising the achievement of young people who selflessly help their families and friends, giving their time and efforts to support others without expectation of reward

Citizenship and community

Recognising the achievement of young people who perform as good citizens and make efforts within their local community through voluntary working and efforts

Environment and sustainability

Recognising the achievements of young people who make a difference in contribution to environmental projects or who try and improve sustainability of local resources

Personal development

Recognising the development of an individual, who through self determination has demonstrated personal growth, a personal journey worthy of celebration and recognition

These awards are one way in which we can put into the spotlight many young people who are so often unsung heroes. The awards are a chance for us all to recognise the hard work and value that young people bring to their communities in Worcestershire.

Nominations are welcomed from anybody who has an involvement with young people - teachers, youth workers, sports coaches, volunteers, family and friends are all welcome to acknowledge the efforts made by young people.

The Tryangle Awards are about recognising and celebrating effort, we are not only celebrating the high fliers but we want to applaud the real triers too!

Every young person nominated will receive a certificate to show that his or her efforts have been recognised. A panel of judges will then select people in each of the eight categories to be selected to receive a Tryangle Awards Trophy, which will be presented at a special awards evening in front of family, friends and invited guests on March 29th 2012 at Worcester Warriors Rugby Club, Six Ways.

Here are some examples of successful Tryangle awards;

Bravery; Young people who persevere to achieve in their community, in school, at sport or through adversity to do the best they can

Citizenship; A young woman giving over 400 hours voluntary service to the St John's Ambulance, and others giving up their time to support a drop in youth centre

Sports; Young People who do their best to achieve in sports, or support others to achieve their best such as the young woman supporting and developing a wheelchair basketball club or the young man organising inter school competitions

Arts; Young people working with older members of the community to create a mural, and young people using African Drumming to raise cultural awareness

Environmental; Young people working with rangers from the Wyre Forest, raising pigs and litter picking to improve their own local community

Music; Young people performing for peers and friends, young people who work hard to achieve the best they can in music

Good Friends & Carers; young people who go that extra mile to support family and friends when they need that little bit extra support

Personal Development; people who achieve in their own lives despite having to overcome challenges and difficulties that they find difficult
