Coalfields Regeneration Trust - Main Grants

Extended Description:

The Coalfields Regeneration Trust is an independent grant making body dedicated exclusively to the regeneration of coalfield communities. Since its launch in 1999, the Coalfields Regeneration Trust has become a key agency promoting and achieving social and economic regeneration in the coalfield communities of England, Scotland and Wales.

The Trust is funded by the Department for Communities and Local Government, The Welsh Assembly, and Communities Scotland.

Organisations will be supported under the following themes:

Supporting Communities To play an active part in regeneration with a focus on:

- Providing access to facilities and services and tackling issues of geographical isolation.
- Promoting healthier lifestyles and linking communities to wider health provision.
- Supporting projects that combat the exclusion of communities from financial services, poverty and debt.
- Supporting projects that build on active citizenship and local participation.

Learning Communities Ensuring that the best possible learning facilities and resources are provided to coalfield communities through:

- Supporting projects that raise aspirations and encourage people in learning through formal and informal education.
- Supporting early years play, pre-school and out of school activity for children, including summer camps.
- Encouraging personal development, youth work activity, volunteering and mentoring schemes.

- Supporting intergenerational activity, accredited and non-accredited courses.

Supporting People into Work By complimenting government employment initiatives, including:

- Supporting projects that improve the employability of all age ranges through wage subsidy, vocational skills and bespoke training schemes.
- Promoting initiatives that have a wide range of support for the hard to reach.
- Activity focusing on growth industries providing bespoke training and job guarantee schemes.
- Focussing on transitional labour market programmes.

Enterprising Communities Increasing the range and diversity of the social economy through initiatives to kick-start social enterprise and support organisations in pursuing income generation strategies by:

- Providing start-up costs for emerging enterprises.
- Providing asset development where this facilitates sustainability.
- Supporting business training, project management and development programmes.
- Providing initiatives, which focus on sharing resources, contracting and clustering.

On 29 October 2007 Housing Minister Yvette Cooper announced that due to a strong evaluation, funding for the Trust, which was due to end in March 2008, has been provisionally extended by a further three years. The new funding programme runs from 1st April 2008 and will close on the 31st March 2011.

Voluntary and Community Groups Most voluntary and community groups working to regenerate coalfield communities are eligible to apply for funding. The Trust classifies Parish, Town and Community Councils as voluntary bodies. While Schools, Colleges and Local Education Authorities are clearly statutory, Parent Teacher Associations or similar small groups linked to statutory bodies are also classed as voluntary. Voluntary and community organisations may apply for grants from any of the Trust's Grant Programmes.

The Trust may make grants to voluntary and community organisations if they:

- Have a constitution or a set of rules which demonstrates that the group is legally eligible to receive a grant and entitled to pursue the planned project.
- Have a bank, or building society account in the name of the organisation with the signatures of at least two appropriate people required for each cheque/payment.
- Have annual accounts, or for new organisations, a detailed budget showing full operational costs
- Submit an application which in the opinion of the Trustees will make a positive contribution to coalfield regeneration and which has been comprehensively and sensibly costed and planned.
- Undertake, when offered a grant, to comply with the Trust's Terms and Conditions, monitoring, evaluation and reporting requirements.

Branches of Larger Organisations The Trust can accept applications from branches of large organisations. It will be important that the branch has its own independent constitution, bank or building society account, trading accounts and management board or committee. The Trust will in any event require written support from the applicant's parent body for any branch application.

Statutory Organisations Statutory Organisations including Local Authorities are entitled to apply for funds. Applications should be for projects that are transparently costed and additional to existing programmes. Local authorities, health authorities, including health trusts, Further Education Colleges, schools and other bodies that receive public funds will be classed as statutory bodies. Statutory Organisations may only apply for grants in excess of £30,000. Statutory Organisations will only be funded if it can be demonstrated that no other organisation within the community can deliver the project effectively.

All projects should be based in an eligible coalfield community or be able to show clear and immediate benefits for an eligible coalfield community.

- The applicant organisation's skills, experience and ability to manage the project.
- Value for money.

- Bank, finance or audit charges.
- Depreciation.
- Recoverable VAT.
- Fees for independent or external professional fundraisers.

The Foundation was established by the publisher and philanthropist Paul Hamlyn in 1987, who, upon his death in 2001, left the majority of his estate to the Foundation - now one of the largest independent grant-making bodies in the UK. The Foundation makes grants to organisations which aim to maximise opportunities for individuals to experience a full quality of life, both now and in the future. In particular they are concerned with children and young people, and others who are disadvantaged.
